
Crow Wing Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 5, which is located in the Northwest Planning Region.

Crow Wing Co. suffered a negative natural increase - more deaths than births from 2020 to 2021, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Crow Wing Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 1).




Figure 1. Population Pyramid, 2000-2020

Crow Wing Co.'s population increased over the past decade, ranking as the 18th fastest growing of the 87 counties in the state from 2010 to 2020. It is now the 15th largest in the state. Crow Wing Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).



Figure 2. Place of Birth for the Foreign Born Population, 2020




POPULATION PROJECTIONS

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Crow Wing Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2023 to 2033, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (5.6%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Crow Wing Co. has a higher percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (92.8%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Crow Wing Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.



LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 4%, Crow Wing Co. had a higher unemployment rate than the state in 2021. After the pandemic recession Crow Wing Co.'s unemployment rate decreased compared to 7.4% in 2020, and declined compared to the 4.6% rate posted in 2019, pre-pandemic. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Crow Wing Co. declined over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.




Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates Minnesota Crow Wing Co. 34,000 3,200,000 33,408 3,150,000 33,000 3,100,000 ocal Labor Force **834** 3,050,000 32,000 3,000,000 31,000 2,950,000 29 2,900,000 30,000 2,850,000 2,800,000 29,000 2,750,000 28,000 2,700,000


Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of 813 workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Crow Wing Co. averaged an annual gain of 290.4 new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of 50.3 new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Crow Wing Co. is expected to see a labor force decline from 2023 to 2033 (see Table 6).

The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. Job vacancies in Northwest reached new highs in the 4th quarter of 2021, quickly bringing back challenges in finding new workers and the lowest jobseeker-per-vacancy ratio on record (see Figure 8).




LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Crow Wing Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Crow Wing Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 84.8% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.



The cost of living has increased over the past year with costs up in many areas. Crow Wing Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$13.97 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$16.15 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

OCCUPATIONS

At \$18.83 in 2021, wages were lower in Region 5 than the state. Overall, Region 5 had the lowest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$37.86) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$13.19) (see Table 11).



Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2006-2021


