## Resolution of Support and Approval for Submittal of the US Highway 212 Rural Freight Mobility and Safety Project to US DOT's RAISE Program

- WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) is soliciting applications for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity "RAISE" Program, which provides dedicated, discretionary funding for transportation projects of national or regional significance; and
- WHEREAS, \$1.5 billion in FY 2022 RAISE funds are available for awards, with 50 percent directed towards projects in rural areas; and
- WHEREAS, the USDOT is focusing the competition on transportation infrastructure projects that support eight key objectives: Safety; Environmental Sustainability; Quality of Life; Mobility and Community Connectivity; Economic Competitiveness and Opportunity; State of Good Repair; Partnership and Collaboration; and Innovation; and
- WHEREAS, Carver County, in partnership with the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) is seeking funds to reconstruct US Highway 212, part of the National Highway System and identified by MnDOT as a Critical Rural Freight Corridor, from a two-lane rural highway to a four-lane divided expressway between County Highway 34 and County Highway 36; and
- WHEREAS, the proposed improvements will remove barriers to efficient freight movement and job opportunities, support economic vitality by providing development opportunities at key locations, preserve existing infrastructure, address climate change and environmental considerations in the project area, and improve mobility and safety for all corridor users; and
- WHEREAS, the Carver County Board of Commissioners adopted a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> percent local option sales tax in May 2017 dedicated for transportation projects. This project is identified in the implementation plan for use of these funds and is a new local revenue source to match federal funds; and
- WHEREAS, Carver County will provide funding towards the local match and partner with MnDOT to contribute to the overall local match and project funding as identified in the RAISE Program application, which includes the use of funding programmed for maintenance, secured funding through other grant programs, and additional program funding as applicable; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Carver County Board of Commissioners supports and approves submittal of the US Highway 212 Rural Freight Mobility and Safety Project for consideration to the USDOT's FY 2022 RAISE Program to reconstruct US Highway 212 from a two-lane undivided highway to a four-lane divided expressway between County Highway 34 and County Highway 36 and authorizes and directs the Carver County Engineer to submit the application.
